BYLAW NO: 839-14

BEING A BYLAW OF BRAZEAU COUNTY, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO ESTABLISH DESIGNATED OFFICERS PURSUANT TO THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT, REVISED STATUTES OF ALBERTA 2000, CHAPTER M-26.

WHEREAS, Council for Brazeau County, pursuant to Section 210 of the Municipal Government Act, may by bylaw establish one or more positions to carry out the powers, duties and functions of a designated officer under this or any other enactment or bylaw.

WHEREAS, a Chief Administrative Officer may delegate, pursuant to Section 209 of the Municipal Government Act, any of the Chief Administrative Officer's powers, duties or functions under this or any other enactment or bylaw to a designated officer or an employee of the municipality.

WHEREAS, Section 623 of the Municipal Government Act provides for a subdivision authority, which may include a designated officer.

WHEREAS, Section 624 of the Municipal Government Act provides for a development authority, which may include a designated officer.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of Brazeau County, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

- (1) That the following positions be established as designated officer positions:
 - (a) Director of Community Services
 - (b) Director of Corporate Services
 - (c) Director of Public Works & Infrastructure
 - (d) Planning & Development Manager
 - (e) Development Officer
 - (f) Taxation Coordinator
 - (g) Assessor

- (2) That the Chief Administrative Officer may exercise all of the powers, duties and functions of the above designated officer positions.

(3) That this bylaw shall replace Bylaw 803-13 and said bylaw is hereby repealed.

(4) That this bylaw shall take effect upon the final passing thereof.
